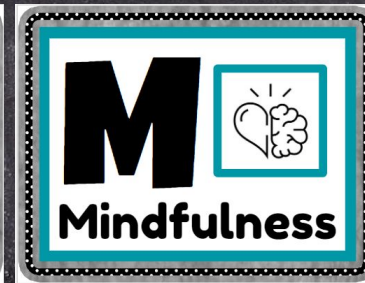

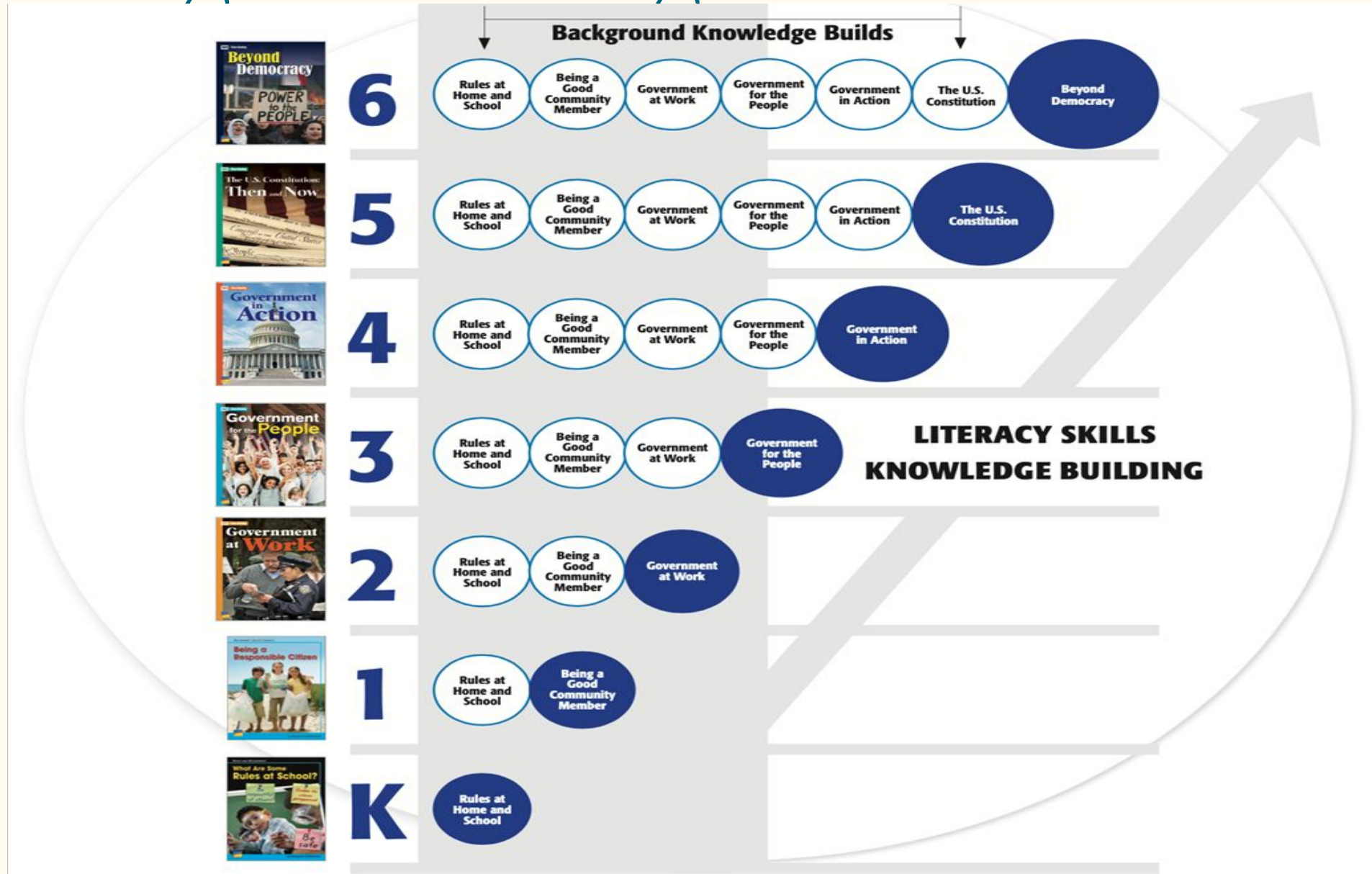

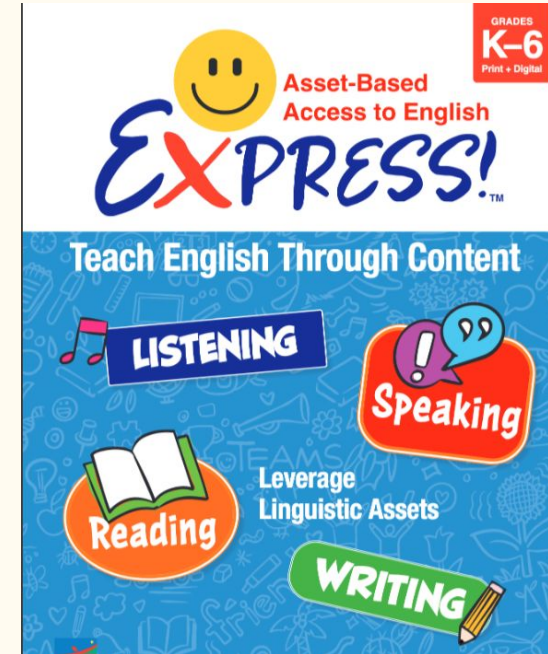

# Math
